New school update: Keeping everything crossed this time...

Plans for our new school have nudged forward a little bit since last week. The city council's **Education Operational Delivery Committee met** and agreed to relocate the existing Milltimber Primary School to a new building on an identified site within the Oldfold Farm development with effect from August 2021, or as soon as possible thereafter, subject to approval of the fully costed business case at City Growth and Resources **Committee.** We will keep tabs on this and let you know when this happens.
